Hunger Ministry, Churches United of the Quad City Area

Sunday, October 2nd is the date of the 40th annual CROP Walk sponsored by Churches United of the Quad City Area. Like CROP Walks throughout Iowa and the nation, their event raises awareness in the community about hunger and gathers up non-perishable food items to stock one of their 25 food pantry sites.

Last year's event raised over \$43,000 in support of the work of Church World Service in more than 80 countries worldwide to respond to hunger and foster self-reliance. One quarter of these funds remained in the Quad Cities for local hunger relief efforts, such as Churches United's hot meal

program, which provides dinners each evening in three sites throughout the year to hungry families.

This year also marks the 50th anniversary of Churches United. They are a cooperative association of 137 member churches representing more than 20 Christian faith traditions in the region, including United Methodist churches. Their mission is to (1) unite Christian churches, (2) empower them for service, and (3) honor diversity. They are rooted in faith, focused on people, and dedicated to service.
