Brynne Howard is a United Methodist missionary, a Church and Community Worker, serving as an attorney with Iowa Justice for Our Neighbors (JFON).

She wrote of Richard\*, who brought 17-year-old Javier\* to a JFON legal clinic last January. "Javier was brought to the U. S. from Guatemala as a young child.
