Last year the Crescent Park United Methodist Church in Sioux City ran their Kids for Christ program for the children in their own congregation. In 2011 they expanded to invite children from three neighboring schools — and doubled their weekly attendance to about thirty! This outreach is another example of churches creating new places for new people.

Preschool to fifth grade children and some of their parents were served a meal each Wednesday evening. The opening activity was lead by five confirmation kids who assist each week in the classrooms.

Participants chose from six classes, which are offered in six-week sessions, on scrapbooking, sewing, musical bells, woodworking, drama, and yoga for kids.
