Every Monday night the church opens its doors and invites all members of the community to come in and enjoy a free meal. On average 150-170 people are fed every week.

They noticed that a number of hungry children were attending, so a Lunch and Learn program began to offer a meal to children when they were not

in school as well as an opportunity for some hands-on learning with teachers. Sixty to 75 children are served at each meal. During the summer children read, take part in educational games, hone skills in reading and math, and learn about gardening and cooking among other things.
