Churches United is an ecumenical organization with an office in Bettendorf that serves persons in need in the Quad Cities. Their first meal site was opened in 1982. Currently, three sites are maintained: one in Davenport and two across the Mississippi River in Illinois. In 2009 over 32,000 meals were served among the three sites.

Churches United also operates 26 food pantries, which are run by more

than 400 volunteers. Each pantry is designed to serve specific neighborhoods. Some are open daily; others once or twice a week, depending on the need. Over 109,000 individuals were served in 2009, representing more than 28,000 visits.

Support for Churches United comes from Thanksgiving Ingathering donations that support hunger ministries. The Southeast District Matthew 25 fund, which is available from Iowa Conference apportionments, also provides a grant to the organization.
