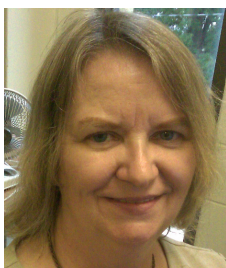

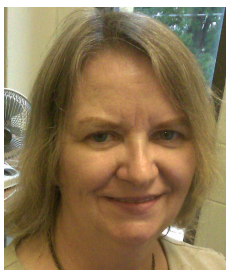
Local church historians regularly send material to the archives office, located in the J. Raymond Chadwick Library on the campus of Iowa
