### The Meth-Wick Community, Cedar Rapids

The Meth-Wick Community has been providing continuing care retirement community services in Cedar Rapids for nearly 50 years. Its mission is to provide a secure and caring living environment, allowing residents to maintain their dignity and enrich the quality of their lives as they age.

Attorney Barthinius Wick bequeathed \$308,000 in 1949 to be used for establishing a retirement home for men. While there was a Home for Aged Women in Cedar Rapids, there was no such facility for men.

By 1961, the bequest had grown to

\$715,000 and the trustees felt it was time to move forward. They contacted the United Methodist Church, which had constructed Friendship Village in Fort Dodge and had experience in the new concept of not-for-profit residential retirement living.

Trustees felt Mr. Wick wouldn't mind if his money was used to build a home for men and women, since his legacy would be supporting a larger program than he originally envisioned. With Mr. Wick's money and the expertise of professionals in the Church, Meth-Wick was born.
