### CROSSWALK TEEN CENTER, HAWARDEN

A Northwest District Matthew 25 grant has helped to fund the work of Arlys Cauwels, the administrator of the Crosswalk Teen Center in Hawarden. Her work coordinates the many volunteers and events that reach out to young people in the surrounding region.

The middle school and high school students served by this ministry come from a variety of racial backgrounds. Some have a church affiliation, but many do not.

Barb Joy, pastor of the United Methodist Church in Hawarden, writes, "We are seeing God working in and

through all of our actions. We are very blessed to have this connection into the wider community."

As volunteers get to know the students, they begin to share their stories about how God has made a difference in their lives. Students are free to ask many questions about life and faith to nurture them in their spiritual development.

The center is a place for youth to drop in and do homework after school. Special events, like the rock concert pictured, give kids a chance to let their hair down (or up?) in a safe environment.
