Mission Ingathering – hands on engaged in outreach!

Our relationship with Midwest Mission Distribution Center, an UMCOR–cooperating depot near Springfield, IL, is growing stronger. Their philosophy is to collect and distribute to those in a time of crisis as quickly as possible – and to include a prayer card (which MMDC will supply) in each kit, signed by the kit-maker! That personal touch makes a difference, to both giver and recipient.

You'll see changes this year that reflect our excitement about this connection; all kits are being assembled per MMDC directions. They evaluate recipients' needs and item costs each January, so this list is current for 2020 and will not change until 2021. Newer kits for us are the **Personal Dignity** (formerly "hygiene kits" but now with additional items) and **Feminine Hygiene Kits**. **Layette** and **Birthing Kits** are back, also with updated contents. **Student Kits**, now ONLY in one-handle cloth bags, continue to be the most requested. Instructions and pattern links are with the kit info.

The remittance form is updated. Your cash gifts for Church World Service, Heifer Project, Self-Help, Mobility Worldwide Iowa Hawarden and Ingathering itself are greatly appreciated. We expect questions, and ask you to contact your District Ingathering representative listed below. They will help you get prayer cards and bags if you need them. REMITTANCE FORM INSTRUCTIONS

1. Fill out Remittance Form, list your 6-digit church number, church name and complete mailing address. List name of contact person, home phone or cell number and personal email address in case questions arise. Make a copy of Remittance Form for your records.
2. Left-hand column is for Cash & Checks. Designate the amount on appropriate line that your church wishes to donate. We encourage churches to donate \$2 per kit to defray shipping expenses. Sub-total cash column. Enclose matching amount of money with Remittance Form. It is preferred that one check be written to "Mission Ingathering." Bring Remittance Form and money to Ingathering Site Office or mail in advance to Site Treasurer.
3. Middle column is for Kits. List the number of kits and multiply by assigned value. Sub-total the In-Kind column. Your church receives credit for the value of complete kits donated. Bring Remittance Form to Ingathering Site Office.
4. NEVER put cash inside kits or inside boxes. All money should be with Remittance Form.
5. List ONLY cash and kits brought on Ingathering Day.
6. Do NOT list any gifts previously given. Cash sent to the Conference and identified for Mission Ingathering will receive credit.
7. The right column of Remittance Form will be completed by Site Treasurer after Bazaar and Auction items are sold.
8. Each bazaar item must be tagged with your church number and price. Auctioned quilts and woodcrafts require the Quilt/Woodcraft Form in booklet be completed and attached.
9. All kits are to be in separate boxes by type of kit. Do NOT mix kit types. Pack only complete kits. Do not seal the boxes. Mark on outside of box the number and type of kits. They will be repacked into uniform boxes at the site.
10. December Church Remittance Statements will show credit for in-kind donations.
11. For any questions about the Remittance Form or other procedures, call your Site Chair, Site Treasurer listed in back of book, or Harvey and Mary Davis at 800-228-2853.

MIDWEST MISSION DISTRIBUTION CENTER IS A PLACE OF MISSION FOR UNITED METHODISTS

Midwest Mission began in 2000 and is a related ministry of the United Methodist Church. The Board of Directors is made up of two delegates from each conference of the North Central Jurisdiction and up to three delegates from neighboring conferences. Midwest Mission collects Student, Layette, Birthing, Feminine Hygiene, and Personal Dignity kits for distribution in response to requests within and beyond the United States.

Midwest Mission collects, makes, assembles, and restores supplies for humanitarian and disaster relief. Supplies are given free of charge regardless of gender, race or religion. Midwest Mission connects with local aid organizations by providing items that are received that do not meet kit requirements. The work is done by volunteers who come from all over the U.S. to serve. The 30,000 square-foot facility is located on an 8-acre campus 4 miles south of Springfield, Illinois. They partner with Food for the Poor, Franciscan Mission Warehouse, Christians in Mission, and U.S. Military South Command donating supplies to humanitarian aid missions in Latin & South America, Caribbean, and Africa.

Midwest Mission sent 33 international shipments to these locations in 2019: Dominican Republic, Jamaica, Honduras, El Salvador, Uganda, Bahamas, Guatemala, Haiti, Tanzania, Guyana (South Comm), Kenya, Burundi, Mexico, Bolivia, Ukraine, Philippines, Gambia and Zimbabwe.

3 Pieces of Cotton String, each 12" long No yarn

1 Razor Blade - single edge - cover in paper or cardboard to prevent injury

2 Receiving Blankets - 28" x 28" to 32" x 32" - No crib, fleece or thermal blankets)

BAZAAR & LIVE AUCTION INFORMATION

BAZAAR ITEMS

All bazaar items should be of outstanding quality and are to be handmade and new. At sites where allowed, baked goods are also in high demand. Check individual site schedules for any restrictions.

- Each bazaar item must be tagged with the church name and number and price in order for your church to receive credit. (Please pin tags on cloth items).
- Churches donating items with no church name or number will not receive credit for these items.
- The site committee will donate any unsold items not claimed by the donating church at the end of the day.

QUILTERS AND CRAFTERS

Both quilts and woodcraft items will be featured at our Ingathering auctions. Your creativity and long hours of work will be the highlight of the show! Auction items will be displayed and then sold during the auctions.

POLICIES

The quilt/woodcraft auction cashier will have available an "Acknowledgement of Donation" form for the buyers when they pay the cashier after the auction. This donation form may be needed by the buyer of any outstanding large quilt or woodcraft item depending upon the purchase price, because the donation form is necessary for tax purposes **if the buyer has paid more than \$250 ABOVE the Fair Market Value (appraised value) for the item.** The form attached to the auction item may be used to fill out the "Acknowledgement of Donation" form. The donation form can be signed by the auction cashier and the site chair.

Only the person or church **donating** an auctioned craft may designate it to any of the five Ingathering projects. This information must be attached to the Remittance Form for proper crediting.

The quilt/woodcraft auction cashier will have available an "Acknowledgement of Donation" form for the buyers when they pay the cashier after the auction. This donation form MAY be needed by the buyer of any large item depending on the purchase price, because the donation form is necessary for tax purposes if the buyer has paid more than \$250 above the Fair Market Value (appraised value) for the item. The form attached to the auction item may be used as the "Acknowledgement of Donation" form, when signed by the auction cashier and the site chair.

The Fair Market Value (appraised value) should be determined by the donating church group for each of their donated items and written on the above form before the quilt or woodcraft item is brought to the Mission Ingathering auction site. For most tied comforters, baby quilts, wall hangings, or other small projects, it would be very rare for them to bring the \$250 above the appraised value that would require the "Acknowledgement of Donation" form required for tax purposes.

The tax deduction may be taken for any price paid above the appraised or fair market value as a donation to the Mission Ingathering.

A good way to promote quilts is to display them in the donating church and take reserve bids. Highest bids for a given item often come from a local church member or person in the community.

MOBILITY WORLDWIDE IOWA - HAWARDEN



Mobility Worldwide was formerly known as Personal Energy Transportation, or P.E.T. It is a global charity that builds and provides three-wheeled, off-road wheelchairs to those unable to walk in the developing world. The name, Mobility Worldwide, better focuses attention on our mission of mobility for those unable to walk.

Mobility Worldwide first began as the P.E.T. Mobility Project by Reverend Mel West and missionary Larry Hills in 1994. Today, Mobility Carts are distributed in over 100 countries. Each cart is built at one of 23 production facilities and donated to distribution partners who handle the shipping, importation and assessment of beneficiaries. Mobility Worldwide is a tax-exempt 501 (C) (3) organization with a mission of: Seeking to reflect the love of God by bringing mobility and dignity to those in developing countries who are unable to walk. While the "flagship" operation is located in Columbia, MO, Mobility Worldwide is a virtual organization with staff located throughout the US and Zambia. The executive director works out of the Atlanta, GA area.

Through a network of 23 Affiliates throughout the US and another in Zambia, Mobility Worldwide has manufactured over 57,000 Mobility Carts and offered them free of charge to people who have lost the use of their legs due to landmines, birth defects, disease or other injuries.
