 - a. In your own words briefly tell us what this book is about.
 - b. What are some key “take-a-ways?” In other words what did you learn and how will you apply it?
 - c. What is at least one question generated by the text you can bring to class?
2. Read Part IV and Part VI (Pages 93-103 and Pages 147-204) of the Book of Discipline.
 - a. What are three things you learned from this reading?
 - b. Write down three questions generated from your reading of the Discipline.
